Key Discussion Points

Survey Updates and Participation (Gabe, Vancie and Juniper)

- Survey extended to January/February to increase responses.
- Target participation estimated at 50 institutions, 100 food businesses, and 200 farmers.
- Total of 74 responses including farmers, food businesses, and institutions.
- Distribution of responses across counties: Warren, Vance, Granville, Person, Franklin.
- Strategies to increase participation include leveraging existing events and meetings.
- Minor changes to the survey questions but maintaining question consistency for data compatibility emphasized.

From the Survey: Farmers' Needs and Support (Juniper)

- Farmers seek grants and funding opportunities.
- Desire for networking with markets, stores, and processors to sell products.
- Advocacy for supportive policies and infrastructure resources (tractors, hoop houses).
- Interest in workshops on marketing, healthy soil, estate/farm transition planning, cover crop breeding.
- Resource sharing such as co-ops, bulk purchasing, equipment sharing, and shared labor discussed.

From the Survey: Food Businesses and Institutions (Juniper)

- Challenges in sourcing locally include limited supply/volume, vendor relationships, storage, staffing, and payment terms.
- Institutions and businesses expressed interest in starting local purchasing.
- Coordination by the Food Council to facilitate multiple sources for institutions suggested.

Regional Food System Modeling Project (Vancie)

• Collaborative project with Working Landscapes to build a system dynamics model of the regional food system.

- Model aims to help understand system components, relationships, and test policy interventions.
- Workshops planned to co-create the model with stakeholders including farmers, businesses, institutions, and educators.
- Workshops structured in three iterative sessions/workshops with participation incentives (stipends, childcare, food).
- Goal to enhance systems thinking, consensus, and informed decision-making within the council.

Committee Updates (Gabe, Alejandra, Judith)

- Agriculture Committee: Focus on listening to farmers' needs, planning a listening event on farmer wellness and health, meeting dates to be scheduled, objective completion by May 2026.
- Food Security and Access Committee: Mapping regional food distribution, updating pantry information, identifying distribution gaps, next meeting scheduled for November 5th at 2 p.m. at Kerr-Tar office.
- Assessment Committee: The details discussed above provided about the food survey.

Food Pantry and Food Hub Activities Granville County (Wendy)

- Updates on Right for Revival nonprofit and food distribution events in Butner, Oxford, and Granville County.
- Farm to Fridge project collecting and redistributing excess food to food insecure populations, with significant partnerships and grant support.
- Collaboration with local farmers, restaurants, and food pantries to support local food sourcing and reduce waste.
- Increase in demand for food assistance noted, especially among seniors, veterans, and homeless populations.
- Discussion on funding mechanisms, grant sources (Blue Cross Blue Shield, USDA, ARPA, local government), and payment processes for farmers.
- Emphasis on community collaboration and volunteer involvement.

- Rural Health Day Fair GRRO in collaboration with the Vance County Farmers' Market and Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina on November 20th, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Farmers Market.
