Counties eligible to apply include Chatham, Durham, Edgecombe, Franklin, Granville, Harnett, Johnston, Lee, Nash, Orange, Person, Vance, Wake, Warren, and Wilson.

• Who Can Apply?

- 501(c)(3) nonprofits
- Governmental entities (counties, municipalities, community colleges, universities, etc.)
- Application Process
 - County managers will submit and endorse projects for consideration.
 - Regional projects do not require county manager endorsement but must meet eligibility criteria.

This funding will help cover expenses such as transportation and lodging, ensuring the team can focus on their performance.

GRANT OPPORTUNITY: RECREATIONAL TRAILS PROGRAM GRANTS

The North Carolina Trails Program offers grant funding for "shovel-ready" trail projects that promote connectivity, accessibility, and sustainable recreation. These grants support local economic development through natural resource tourism. In addition, the spring 2025 grant round for the RTP Safety and Education Grant (SEG), each up to \$5,000, has also opened. Federal, state, or local government agencies, as well as qualified nonprofit organizations, are eligible to apply for both grants. division of parks and recreation Grant Details: NCTRAILS

- Funding Range: \$10,000 \$100,000
- Match Requirement: 25% of RTP funds received
- Deadline: September 5, 2025, by 5 p.m.

Agencies may submit one application per project. A formal review is available before final submission to ensure compliance with RTP guidelines. The Grants Management System (GMS) handles applications and payments, requiring registration in the North Carolina Financial System (NCFS).



How to Contest Wired Broadband Connection:

- 1. Visit website: https://broadbandmap.fcc.gov/
- 2. Type in the address of the location
- 3. Make sure you have selected "Fixed Broadband" on the right side menu.
- 4. Select "Availability Challenge" and answer the prompts
- 5. Use the FCC Speed Test App's "Single Test""Crowdsource" option and download the speed test data to submit into the 'Availability Challenge'

igodologie 10 Easy Steps

- 1. Download the FCC Speed Test App.
- 2. Allow permissions for the app.
- 3. Connect to WiFi you want to test.
- 4. Go to "Settings" and then "User Information" to create your account.
- 5. Once you have provided the information hit "Confirm & Continue."
- 6. Go to "Speed" and a map should appear with testing options.
- 7. Select "Single" and "Crowdsource"
- 8. Select "Start Test", then "Confirm & Continue", then "Indoor."
- 9. Wait for the speed test to run.
- 10. Record the "TestID" or select "History" and then "Crowdsource."


GRANVILLE HEALTH SYSTEM'S ANNUAL AMBULANCE CHASE

- Al-powered scams like deepfakes and phishing emails that are harder to spot.
