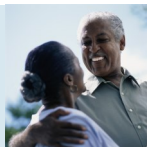
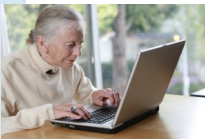

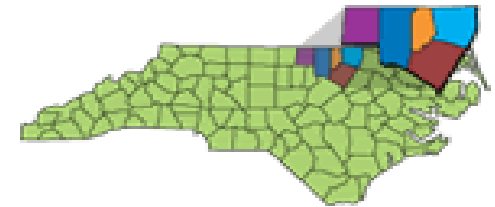

Who Are We?

The Kerr-Tar Area Agency on Aging (AAA), is the organization mandated under the provisions of the Older Americans Act of 1965, as amended, to work on behalf of older adults and their caregivers in Franklin, Granville, Person, Vance, and Warren Counties.

The AAA coordinates such activities as:

- Development and implementation of a comprehensive care system for older citizens.
- Advocates for improved services for older adults and their families.
- Information and referral to local resources.
- Allocation and management of funding for services to the region.
- Technical Assistance to agencies which serve older adults.
- Administrative support of the region's delegation to the NC Senior Tarheel Legislature.
- Regional Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program.
- Family Caregiver Support Program

Services for Older Adults In Our Region

The Area Agency on Aging assists counties as they study the needs of older adults and plan services to meet those needs. The goal of providing these services is to enable older adults to live independently in their own homes as long as possible.

Services in most counties include:

Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program

The Long Term Care (LTC) Ombudsman Program allows for the Area Agency on Aging to provide a full time staff member whose primary responsibilities are to:

- Serve as an advocate for residents of long term care facilities such as nursing homes and adult care homes (rest homes, family care, etc.)
- Investigate and resolve complaints made by residents of long term care facilities, or by family members of residents.
- Provide training and technical assistance to community advisory committees
- Promote community involvement in long term care facilities
- Promote awareness of Elder Abuse and Neglect

Residents and their families or friends may contact the Ombudsman regarding any concern they have about the treatment of a resident of a nursing facility, adult care home, or family care home in Franklin, Granville, Person, Vance and Warren counties.

Family Caregiver Support Program

This program is intended to support unpaid, family or informal caregivers of individuals age 60 and older; grandparents age 55 and older raising grandchildren; as well as caregivers of any individual with organic brain disease, such as Alzheimer's.
