2016 NADO Excellence in Regional Transportation Award Winner

Imagine Bickett Boulevard: Louisburg, North Carolina has been chosen to receive a 2016 NADO Excellence in Regional Transportation Award. The project was a cooperative effort between Kerr-Tar Regional Transportation Planning Organization, the Town of Louisburg and the NCDOT. The document was written, produced and organized by staff from Kerr-Tar RPO with support from the Bickett Boulevard Working Group, the Louisburg Assistant Town Administrator and NCDOT staff including the Division and District Engineer. Ann Stroobant, Kerr-Tar Regional Planner and RPO Coordinator, will present the project at the 2016 National Regional Transportation Conference held in Chattanooga, Tennessee June 13-15, 2016 at a Breakout Session entitled, "Complex Issues in Multimodal Planning".

SOG Coates' Canons 'The Final New Overtime Rule is Finally Here'

On May 18, 2016, the U.S. Department of Labor released the final rule raising the minimum salary an employee must make to be exempt from overtime and, by that act, making many more salaried employees eligible for overtime compensation. The rule may be found here. The changes to the old rule are few and not surprising as they closely track the proposed rule published last July. The most significant change is, as expected, an increase in the amount an employer must pay for an employee to qualify for exempt status. It increases from the current \$455 per week to \$913 per week – that's an increase of just over 100% from \$23,600 annually to \$47,476 annually. The new salary minimum will be effective December 1, 2016. Click here for more information.

Department of the Interior: Historic Preservation Fund Grands to Underrepresented Communities Grant

Grants support the survey, inventory, and designation of historic properties that are associated with communities currently underrepresented in the National Register of Historic Places and among National Historic Landmarks. Within one year of the completion of the grant, all projects must result in: the submission of a new nomination to the National Register of Historic Places or National Historic Landmark program OR an amendment to an existing National Register or National Historic Landmark nomination to include underrepresented communities. Transportation Related Bills Filed in the Short Session

- •H1106 -- Would modify the use of the Connect NC Bond and reallocate \$490 million which was provided to the UNC system to transportation related projects instead. Referred to House finance Committee.
  •H959=S723 -- Recommended changes by the JLOTC regarding local consultation on small transportation projects, turnpike authority, broadband in right of way and bicycle and pedestrian records. Referred to House Transportation Committee and Senate Transportation Committee
- •H963 -- Expending of funds for the secondary road paving program. Referred to House Transportation Committee.
- •H1002 -- Included in H1030 2016 Appropriations Act •S812 -- Similar to H1002, however, appropriates \$23
- million form the Highway fund. Referred to Senate Transportation Committee

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) Division of Bicycle and Pedestrian Transportation Planning Study Solicitation The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) Division of Bicycle and Pedestrian Transportation is soliciting projects of interest for planning studies for large scale bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure projects. The focus of the study is to progress a project from its current long-range plan status to a level where potential engineering issues and reliable cost estimates can be determined. A planning study will consider alternative alignments or design options within a study area, and will identify a preferred alignment and/or design concept. Reimaging Our Streets as Places: From Transit Routes to Community Roots For most of the last century, we have taken for granted the idea that our streets are primarily zones for cars, parking, and the transporting of goods. This has not been the case, however, throughout most of history. Across many cultures and times the street has held vast social, commercial, and political significance as a powerful symbol of the public realm. "Streets as Places" can help make way for these transformations. Taking an integrative approach to the planning, design, and management of our shared public spaces, the growing "Streets as Places" movement is helping people begin to see streets in their entirety. It's not a streetscape design, it's a process; it's about communities owning and reclaiming their streets, participating in civic life, and having a direct impact on how their public spaces look, function, and feel.
