The Community Oriented Policing Services Office (COPS) is releasing several grant opportunities for local and state law enforcement agencies. <u>COPS grants</u> are vital to local law enforcement agencies, and it's equally vital municipalities are ready to submit applications as soon as grants released. Good grant management starts long before a grant application is due. While waiting for the COPS grants RFPs to hit, make it your municipality's responsibility to know exactly what agencies' will be asking for under these funding opportunities – and why. New Grant Funding to Train and Supply EMS & Others to Respond to Opioid Overdose

Under CARA, there is new grant funding local governments can use to train and supply EMS and others in emergency opioid overdose response. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Center for Substance Abuse Prevention is accepting applications for more than \$10 million in funding for the 2017 First Responders Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (CARA) program to address emergency opioid overdose incidents. Between \$250,000 and \$800 000 per year over four years is available to states, tribes and local governmental entities to train and provide resources to first responders and other key community sectors to administer life saving treatment for known or suspected opioid overdose. Grantees will train and provide resources to carry and administer a drug or device approved or cleared under the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act for emergency treatment, such as naloxone. Grantees must also establish processes, protocols, and mechanisms for referral to appropriate treatment and recovery communities. Applications are due July 31, 2017. Our Town Creative Placemaking Grants from NEA

The Our Town grant program supports creative placemaking projects that help to transform communities into lively, beautiful, and resilient places – achieving these community goals through strategies that incorporate arts, culture, and/or design. Creative placemaking is when artists, arts organizations, and community development practitioners deliberately integrate arts and culture into community revitalization work - placing arts at the table with land-use, transportation, economic development, education, housing, infrastructure, and public safety strategies. This funding supports local efforts to enhance quality of life and opportunity for existing residents, increase creative activity, and create or preserve a distinct sense of place. Through Our Town, subject to the availability of funding, the National Endowment for the Arts will provide a limited number of grants for creative placemaking. Our Town requires partnerships between arts organizations and government, other nonprofit organizations, and private entities to achieve livability goals for communities. Our Town offers support for projects in two areas: 1) Arts Engagement, Cultural Planning, and Design Projects. These projects represent the distinct character and quality of their communities. These projects require a partnership between a nonprofit organization and a local government entity, with one of the partners being a cultural organization. Matching grants range from \$25,000 to \$200,000. And 2) Projects that Build Knowledge About Creative Placemaking. These projects are available to arts and design service organizations, and industry, policy, or university organizations that provide technical assistance to those doing placebased work. Kerr-Tar Council of Governments Revolving Loan Fund

The Kerr-Tar Regional Council of Governments administers a Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) to assist existing businesses as well as new entrepreneurs in securing financing they are otherwise unable to secure through traditional channels. The primary goal of the RLF program is to create new jobs in the region. Preference is given to businesses that will add full-time skilled or semi-skilled positions. The source of funding is the Federal Economic Development Administration (EDA). Some specific guidelines may apply. The Kerr-Tar Regional Council of Governments welcomes partnering with other lenders to assist local area business to succeed and thrive. For more information contact Mark Warren. The Kerr-Tar's Loan Committee met on May 16, 2017 in Henderson and approved two micro-enterprise loans. Triangle Regional Freight Plan

The Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) are required to do freight plans for their areas. Near us, the MPOs in Raleigh (CAMPO) and Durham (DCHC) are working on the Triangle Regional Freight Plan to develop freight recommendations for their joint 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan. The consultants working with CAMPO, CDHC and NCDOT are Parsons Brinckerhoff and Baseline Mobility. This particular plan is nearing completion with a final workshop in June/July 2017 (The date has not been determined yet).



FTA Announces \$55M Funding for Low- or No-Emission

The main purpose of the Low-No Program is to support the transition of the nation's transit fleet to the lowest polluting and most energy efficient transit vehicles. The Low-No Program provides funding to State and local governmental authorities for the purchase or lease of zero-emission and low-emission transit buses, including acquisition, construction, and leasing of required supporting facilities. Only \$31.5 million is available under the Continuing Resolution that expires on April 28, 2017. Synopses and full announcement are posted on Grants.gov site as opportunity FTA-2017-003-LowNo. Proposals must be submitted electronically through Grants.gov website by 5 p.m. Eastern Time on 6/26/2017. NC Statewide Freight Plan

This plan was part of the FAST Act 2015 (Federal Highways Fixing Americas Transportation Act) and is updated every 5 years. The critical freight corridors have already been determined by Congress. The projects forming the additional Critical Urban and Critical Rural Freight Corridors will be selected from programmed projects submitted and selected through the prioritization process. The NC Statewide Freight Plan is due to be completed in December 2017. Consultants Cambridge Systematics and Baseline Mobility are working with NCDOT on the plan. Potential Critical Freight Corridors are shown, here, on the interactive map.



CCX Transportation and Freight Master Plan

The Carolinas Gateway Partnership (CGP), the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT), and North Carolina Department of Commerce (NCDOC) are partnering with CSX to develop the Carolina Connector Intermodal Facility (CCX) in Edgecombe County that will provide intermodal access to Rocky Mount, the Twin Counties (Nash and Edgecombe County), the Triangle, and all of eastern North Carolina. A Master Plan of transportation corridor improvements and conceptual land uses surrounding CCX will be prepared. Dewberry is the main consultant on this project. STIP Meeting

On May 16, 2017 David Keilson, our Division 5 Planning Engineer, and Mike Stanley, the STIP Central Region Manager, met with Kerr-Tar RPO staff and interested members to discuss the Draft 2018-2027 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). This meeting discussed the STIP Process which identifies the transportation projects that will receive funding during a 10-year period, as well as any questions and concerns that attendees had related to the Draft STIP that will now be finalized in August. The possibility of Alternate criteria was also discussed to investigate the possibility of modifications to STI scoring for P5.0.
