A few transportation related bills have been filed in this session of the General Assembly. DOT Proposed Legislative Changes (959=S723) and Adjust Unpaved Roads Funding Expenditures (H963).

Agriculture Commissioner, SteveTroxler, was a keynote speaker at the NC Tomorrow Summit held on April 18th and 19th at the North Raleigh Hilton. The NC Tomorrow initiative was the development of a Uniform Process for North Carolina to develop a NC Statewide Strategy for Comprehensive Community and Economic Development. The second phase was to roll regional strategies into a statewide plan.
