Many experts have asserted that the limited range of modern electric vehicles and the amount of time it takes to charge the batteries are the primary reasons why they still make up a miniscule portion of the automobile market — less than 1 percent, according to HybridCars. com. NCWorks Career Center

On Monday, August 22 and Tuesday, August 23 the NCWorks Career Center in Oxford hosted GKN Driveline of Roxboro for a Career Fair. GKN Driveline is the world's leading supplier of automotive driveline technologies and systems. The career fair was to help GKN recruit for a variety of available positions including machine operator, forklift driver, quality technician, and maintenance technician. After having a discussion about reaching out to other candidate pools in our region by having an offsite career fair, GKN scheduled a date and sent a recruiting team consisting of 5 Interviewers and a Scheduler to the NCWorks Career Center in Oxford for 2 full days of interviews. Over the 2 days, 45 potential candidates attended of which 35 have been invited to the GKN Roxboro location to receive pre-hire paperwork and a facility tour. Once a hiring decision has been made GKN and their eligible new hires will be participating in our On the Job Training program as the new employees adjust to their new jobs. GKN is just one of the many examples of how our people are using the programs and services we have to partner with and support the local business community which in turn creates opportunities that strengthen the entire community.
