STIP Prioritization Update: Public Input Submission Phase

The N.C. Department of Transportation is asking the public to provide input on what transportation projects they would like to see included in the state's next 10-Year transportation plan for 2026-2035. With a goal of increasing safety, reducing congestion and promoting economic growth, NCDOT uses data and local input to determine which projects get funded in the 10-year plan based on a specific formula created in accordance with the Strategic Transportation Investments law. The law allows NCDOT to use its funding more efficiently to enhance North Carolina's infrastructure, while supporting economic growth, job creation and a higher quality of life.

We want your input! The purpose of this communication is to invite and encourage your participation in the development of North Carolina's transportation network. A statewide 30-day public comment period to submit project ideas will be **held between July 31 and September 1**. During this period, the public can send project suggestions through a short, interactive survey found on the **2026-2035 STIP webpage**.



There will also be week-long <u>open houses</u> held at all 14 NCDOT highway division offices across the state. People can provide input or speak to NCDOT staff about potential projects in a particular area.

After all input for potential projects is collected, the list of project scores and a draft statewide mobility project list are expected to be released by Spring 2024. There will be another public comment period regarding regional impact projects in Spring 2024, with the same process taking place for division–level projects in Fall 2024. The 2026–2035 draft STIP is scheduled to be released in early 2025, with approval by the Board of Transportation in the summer.

Check out these **HOT** funding opportunities!

- **HOPE VI Main Street Grant**
 - The HOPE VI Main Street Program provides grants to communities smaller than 50,000 in population to assist in the renovation of a historic, traditional central business district, or "Main Street" area by replacing unused, obsolete, commercial space in buildings with affordable housing units. More information **HERE**.
- USDA Rural Energy Funding Programs
 - These programs, authorized by the Agricultural Act of 2014, offer funding to complete energy audits, provide renewable energy development assistance, make energy efficiency improvements and install renewable energy systems. Read more HERE.
- Golden Leaf Site Program
 - Through this program, Golden LEAF will provide support to communities to identify potential sites for economic development, enable completion of due diligence on sites already identified, or extend public utilities to or conduct grading and clearing of sites for which due diligence has been completed. Division of Water Infrastructure Announces Fall 2023 Grant Funding Application Training

The Division of Water Infrastructure in the N.C. Department of Environmental Quality will provide training for completing and submitting applications for the **Fall 2023 Drinking Water**,

Wastewater and Stormwater Loan and Grant funding round. Applications for loan and grant funding for drinking water, wastewater and stormwater projects must be received by the Division no later than **5:00pm on October 2, 2023**. Application training will be offered August 2 through August 10 in Asheville, Hickory, Wilmington, Winterville, and Raleigh. The Aug. 10 Raleigh training session will also offer virtual participation via WebEx and will be recorded and posted on the Division website. There is no registration cost. Potential funding applicants are strongly encouraged to attend an in-person session or listen to a training session online. Training will cover important information including:

- Funding Programs
- Application Package Completion
- Priority Rating Systems
- Funding Timelines
- Instructions on how to apply for Lead Service Line Replacement/Inventory funding & Emerging Contaminants funding

Water Infrastructure Funding Announced





Gov. Roy Cooper's office has announced **\$223 million** in local drinking water, wastewater and storm water projects in the latest round of awards by the State Water Infrastructure Authority. The grants and low-interest loans are part of \$2.8 billion in funding for water-related infrastructure over the past two years, made possible by state and federal legislation. Congratulations to the **City of Henderson** for an award of **\$400,000** for a Stormwater Asset Inventory and Condition Assessment and the **Town of Warrenton** for an award of **\$750,000** for projects at the Waste Water Treatment Plant!

Tonya Parrish, an Army Veteran, had no problem finding employment when she separated from service in 2014. Discouragement came many years later, during the pandemic downturn in 2020. Tonya found herself unemployed from her contractor position and fighting financial obligations. She applied for jobs, but no responses were received. She entered the NCWorks Career Center through word of mouth to meet with the Veterans Employment Services Consultant. After a general discussion and assessment, it was clear that



Tonya possessed the skills and work experience needed within our workforce. The Veterans Employment Services Consultant mapped out an employment plan and a functional resume while, in turn, partnering with NCWorks Business Services, who arranged a meeting with the CEO of White Insurance & Financial Services, which happened to be looking for an Associate. Tonya interviewed and was offered the position to which she was hired as a full-time employee in July. Tonya stated, "I cannot wait to start working and complete the insurance certification." Tonya could not thank us enough as she looks forward to beginning her new career. Congratulations!
