- The Emergency Management Performance Grant Program (EMPG)
 - o The Emergency Management Performance Grant Program (EMPG) is a federal grant program from DHS/FEMA administered through the North Carolina Dept. of Public Safety (NCDPS)/North Carolina Emergency Management (NCEM) in the state of NC. EMPG provides states with funding to implement the National Preparedness System and work towards the National Preparedness Goal of a secure and resilient nation. EMPG's allowable costs support efforts to build and sustain core capabilities across the prevention, protection, mitigation, response, and recovery mission areas to address certain specified national and regional priority areas. - FY23 Historic Preservation Fund-Save America's Treasures Preservation Grants
 - Save America's Treasures grants from the Historic Preservation Fund provide preservation and/or conservation assistance to nationally significant historic properties and collections. Grants are awarded through a competitive process and require a dollar-for-dollar, non-Federal match, which can be cash or documented in-kind. Application deadline is **December 19, 2023**. Vote Today: NCDOT Advance Flood Warning System

NCDOT's advance flood-warning system helps NCDOT staff prepare for and respond more quickly from hurricanes and other severe storms. The system, which relies on a network of over 500 stream gauges and monitors more 2,000 miles of roads, provides critical, real-time information. NCDOT is a finalist in the **2023 America's Transportation Awards** competition for its advance flood-warning system. The agency is competing for the **People's Choice Award**, which is based on online public voting. The award sponsor, American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials, will award the winning state **\$10,000** to be donated to charity. Individuals may vote daily across multiple devices through **November 14, 2023**.
