Need Medicare? Count on the KTAAA!

The Kerr-Tar Area Agency on Aging (KTAAA) has been very busy with Medicare Open Enrollment! What is Open Enrollment? Medicare Open Enrollment happens every fall from **October 15 through December 7**. Our agency staff, Barbara Stewart, Kim Hawkins and Michael Patterson have been assisting seniors across our five county region to ensure that everyone has all their Medicare needs addressed.



Wondering what you can do during the Medicare Open Enrollment period? Here are some of the many options you have:

- Switch from Original Medicare to a Medicare Advantage plan, or vice versa.
- Change from one Medicare Advantage plan to a different Medicare Advantage plan.
- Change from a Medicare Advantage plan without drug coverage to a Medicare Advantage plan with drug coverage, or vice versa.
- Enroll in a Medicare prescription drug plan.
- Jump from one Medicare drug plan to a different Medicare drug plan.
- Quit your Medicare prescription drug coverage.

IEDC Volunteers Visit the Kerr-Tar Region

The Kerr-Tar COG had the honor of hosting two International Economic Development Council (IEDC) volunteers during the months of October and November to conduct a series of strategic visits across our region.

Kicking off our **Small Business & Entrepreneurship week (Oct. 30-Nov. 3)** was Carolyn Rowley, CEcD, Director of Retention & Innovation at Lubbock Economic Development Alliance. Ms. Rowley met with 1–3 small businesses in each of the region's five counties, as well as individual meetings with the economic development staff of each county. Meetings were conducted to gauge available services throughout the region related to small business development and to identify gaps or opportunities for further resources to be provided. The conclusion of the project will result in a report highlighting findings for use in strategic planning moving forward.





Next up was **Business Retention & Expansion week (Nov. 6-Nov. 10)**! Joining us was IEDC volunteer Lynne Stein Benzion, CEcD, Director of Economic Development at Montgomery County Economic Development Corporation in Maryland. The visit began with a brief training on business retention and expansion (BRE) best practices, followed by meetings with industry partners throughout the region. Real time feedback was provided to county economic development staff during the week, and additional resources expanding on the results of conversations and the BRE training will be made available for regional leadership as the region expands BRE efforts.

• Walmart Local Community Grants

- The Walmart Local Community Grants Program provides grants to support the unique needs of local communities in the service areas of Walmart and Sam's Club stores. Funding areas include: Community & Economic Development, Diversity & Inclusion, Education, Environmental Sustainability, Health & Human services, Hunger Relief & Healthy Eating, Public Safety and Quality of Life.  - Funded by the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), this program provides project based funding ranging from \$10,000 \$100,000 with a non-federal one-to-one match with programming focused on creating a healthy and thriving arts and culture ecosystem, elevating artists, facilitating collaborations, investing in capacity building and more.
