



Chapter ONE

Introductions and Overview

The Comprehensive Transportation Plan is North Carolina's long-range transportation plan. The CTP is "needs-based" and represents a community's consensus on the future transportation system to support anticipated growth and development over a 25-30-year timeframe.

PURPOSE AND OVERVIEW

This plan is reviewed by a CTP steering committee comprised of NCDOT, the Southwestern Rural Planning Organization (RPO) and local planning partners.

The CTP supports the community's adopted vision and goals by integrating land use and transportatio planning. This should be used by local officials to ensure that planned transportation facilities reflect the needs of the public, while minimizing the disruption to local residents, businesses and environmental resources. The CTP process is designed to provide useful information into the project development process.

VISION

The CTP vision, goals and objectives are developed as part of the public involvement process and help identify how residents in an area would like to develop the transportation system.

When starting a CTP study, officials form a steering committee of individuals who represent the various needs, issues and populations of the community. The committee develops the draft vision, goals, objectives and performance measures. These are further refined with input from residents and then used to guide the development of the CTP.



Macon County Highway Project Proposals

U.S. 64 (Murphy Road): 66 f 🗐

From the Clay County boundary to W. Old Murphy Road (State Road 1448)

Improve to a two-lane road with a climbing lane to increase mobility in the presence of slower vehicles. Increase shoulders to 4 feet.

U.S. 64 (N. 4th Street): =

From Highlands town limits to the Jackson County line

Modernize to 11-foot lanes with 4-foot paved shoulders

U.S. 441-23, R-5734C: 66 f

From the Georgia state line to Prentiss Bridge Road (State Road 1649)

Redesign to a four-lane, boulevard by replacing the center turn lane with a median. Improve access control at intersections using a reduced conflict intersection design.

U.S. 441 (Sylva Road): ...

From the end of the four-lane section near Sangerstown Road to the Jackson County line

Modernize to a four-lane divided expressway with 12-foot lanes and 4-foot paved shoulders

U.S. 441 (Sylva Road) and

U.S. 441 BUS (E Main Street) Intersection: #

Improve intersection

N.C. 28 (Highlands Road): 6

From U.S. 441 Business (E. Main Street) to Thomas Road

Redesign to a two-lane divided road by replacing the middle left turn lane with a median. Improve access control by using reduced conflict intersection design.

N.C. 28 (Highlands Road):

From Rogers Road to Walnut Creek Road (State Road 1533)

Modernize this road to include 4-foot paved shoulders. While not fully relieving congestion, it was deemed acceptable to pursue minor upgrades.

N.C. 28 (Bryson City Road):

From Sanderstown Road (State Road 1335) to Cowee Creek Road (State Road 1340)

Modernize to 11-foot lanes and 4-foot paved shoulders




